"Process is about doing the most important things the right and best way every time," says Mike Paton, author and EOS Implementer at EOS Worldwide. Yet entrepreneurs often resist process for one or more of these reasons: 1) I'm not a process person, 2) creating processes takes too much time, or 3) process kills creativity. These are all myths.

First, we are all process people. Your morning routine is a process. Entrepreneurs have a process for the best way to provide quality service to their customers. Do it, evaluate it, refine it, and do it again. Not only is that a process but that's an improved process for the next customer.

John Wooden said, "If you don't have time to do it right, when will you have time to do it over?" Consider which takes less time and costs less money: writing a process for your people to consistently follow or re-doing everyone's work over and over.

Finally, knowing and following a process actually opens up the door for creativity within the bounds of the process. This marries creativity and freedom with consistency and efficiency. As Jim Collins puts it, "Magic occurs when you blend a culture of discipline with an ethic of entrepreneurship."
