Reflection + Discussion Questions

Over the past few months, we've been exploring what it means to live out your faith in your business—not just on the margins, but at the core.

In **July**, we focused on your Kingdom calling—how your business can serve a redemptive purpose in the world.

In **August**, we looked at redeeming your time, using tools like AI to eliminate wasted effort so you can focus on what matters most.

Now in **September**, we're asking the deeper question: **What story is your work telling?**

3. Redemption – The Restful View of Work

What would change if you approached your work from a place of rest and security in Christ rather than self-justification?

4. Restoration – The Eternal View of Work

If your work today might become part of God's New Creation, how would that change the way you approach it tomorrow?
